

CHAPTER 76: TRUCK ROUTES

§ 76.01 AUTHORITY TO POST SIGNS.

The Public Works Commissioner is empowered to designate, from time to time, in his or her discretion, truck routes within the city; such routes shall be plainly marked by adequate signs and may be changed from time to time as the Public Works Commissioner believes necessary and he or she shall promulgate such routes in writing and shall file the same with the city finance office. The word **TRUCK** means and includes truck, trailer and semi-trailer. (Prior Code, § 10.16.010) (Ord. 1051, passed 4-16-2018)

§ 76.02 TRUCK DRIVER RESPONSIBILITIES.

It shall be the duty of all truck drivers within the city limits to drive and operate trucks having a gross weight of over 6,000 pounds per axle upon the routes hereinabove designated except trucks making local delivery and service calls. (Prior Code, § 10.16.020)

§ 76.03 SCHOOL BUS ROUTES.

The Public Works Commissioner is further empowered to designate routes for the school buses of the Canton Independent School District within the city; such routes to be promulgated in writing and filed with the city. (Prior Code, § 10.16.030) (Ord. 1051, passed 4-16-2018)

§ 76.04 TEMPORARY TRUCK ROUTES.

The Public Works Commissioner is further empowered to designate in his or her discretion, from time to time, temporary truck routes within the city for any purpose which the Commissioner shall deem necessary for the public good. (Prior Code, § 10.16.040) (Ord. 1051, passed 4-16-2018)

§ 76.05 ENFORCEMENT.

The Chief of Police and all of the officers of the Police Department are authorized and directed to enforce the regulations above referred to and to direct all truck drivers, other than that hereinafter excepted, to travel upon such truck routes. (Prior Code, § 10.16.050)

Truck Routes

§ 76.06 STATE STATUTES OR STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS.

Nothing in the foregoing section shall be construed to modify or change any of the regulations of the State Highway Department or the statutes of the state with reference to the gross weight permitted upon any highways within the city. (Prior Code, § 10.16.060)

§ 76.07 WEIGHING OF VEHICLES.

The Chief of Police and all officers of the Police Department shall have the authority to require any person driving or in control of any commercial vehicle to proceed to any public or private scale available for the purpose of weighing and determining whether this chapter has been complied with. (Prior Code, § 10.16.070)
